#### Reconnaissance

- What companies and agencies are near you and visit them?
  - NIH, Navy Medical Bethesda, FDA, NOAA, NIST, NRC, NSWC, and DoE.
  - Look out for training repayment agreements and noncompete agreements
- Everyone is online, so everyone needs cybersecurity help.
  - So volunteer your services.
- Join professional associations and local chapters: ISSA, OWASP, ISC2, WiCys, and ISACA.
- Go to public events and conferences to meet employees and managers.
  - RSA, ISSA, Bsides, AFCEA, ShmooCon, SANS, CyberMaryland
  - Checking event platforms like Eventbrite, Meetup, or cybersecurity community websites.
- Participate in competitions: PicoCTF, CyberStart, CyberPatriot
- Post your work on GitHub.

## **Preparation: The Elevator Pitch**

- An elevator pitch that is a quick summary of yourself.
- It is the cornerstone of your job search.
- It's named for the time it takes to deliver it during an elevator ride (roughly 30 to 60 seconds or 75 words).
- Elevator pitches sell you, your mission, and talents.
- Always have talking points so you're ready for unexpected opportunities.
- Include a written version of your elevator pitch to "introduce" yourself to employers virtually.
- This can help recruiters find you in a targeted search.
- Eliminate the employers that are not right for you.
- Give your elevator speech. Over and over.
- Prepare practice videos. Post on social media.

#### What should I include in my resume?

- Contact information
- Dates, hours, level of experience, and examples for each work experience
- Relevant volunteer work and roles in community organizations
- Use numbers to highlight your accomplishments
- Give examples of how you saved costs, earned revenue, or managed resources.
- Give examples of how you saved or managed time.

#### What should I leave out of my resume?

- Typos, Lies, and Fluff (I use Grammarly)
- Clever formatting and graphics
- Social Security Number (SSN)
- Photos of yourself
- Confidential information
- Classified or government-sensitive information
- · Personal information, such as age, gender, religious affiliation, etc.
- Encrypted and digitally signed documents

#### Format and organization

- Chronological starting with the most recent and working backward
- Dealing with employment gaps
- Thematic knowledge, skills, and abilities
- Indentation and bullet points to present job history compactly
- Bold and italics to highlight how you meet job requirements





- Word allows companies to use your resume as a proposal without your knowledge.
- PDF is resistant to editing and random font changes.
- Automatic Tracking Systems (ATS) like standard fonts, not arty or cute fonts that may be hard to parse.
- Info in images may not make it into the ATS.





## References and past employers

- Don't include them unless required.
- Save them for later.
- Ask references for their permission.
- Get current contact information.
- How to deal with negative supervisors.



#### **Interview Questions**

Business case – <u>How to do a</u> <u>bubble sort</u>?

Puzzle or problem - "How many tennis balls fit in a 747?"

- 1. Think out loud so the interviewer understands your thinking.
- 2. What variables do you need to make a logical estimate?
- 3. Declare any assumptions you make
- 1. Use the standard reference libraries.
