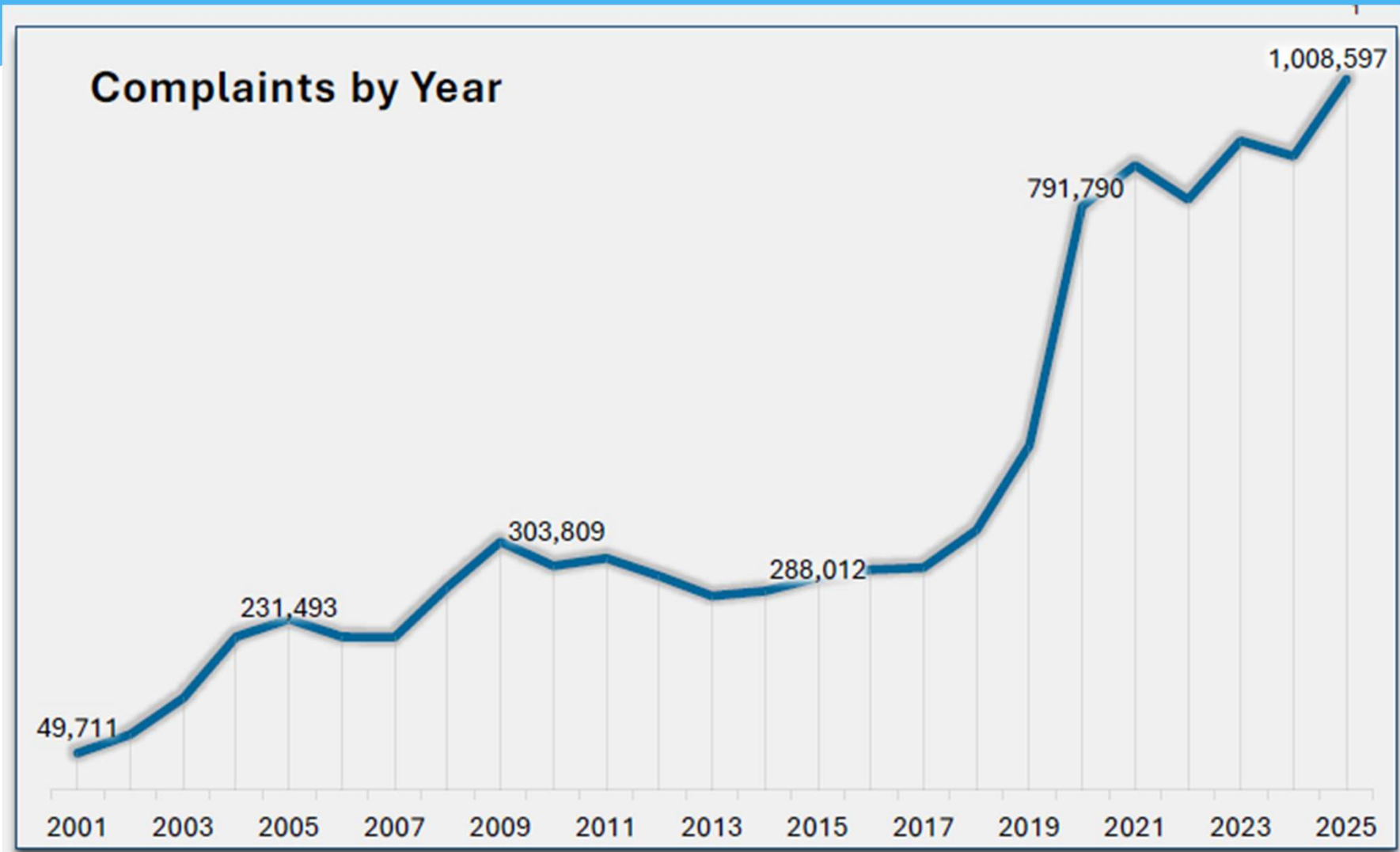

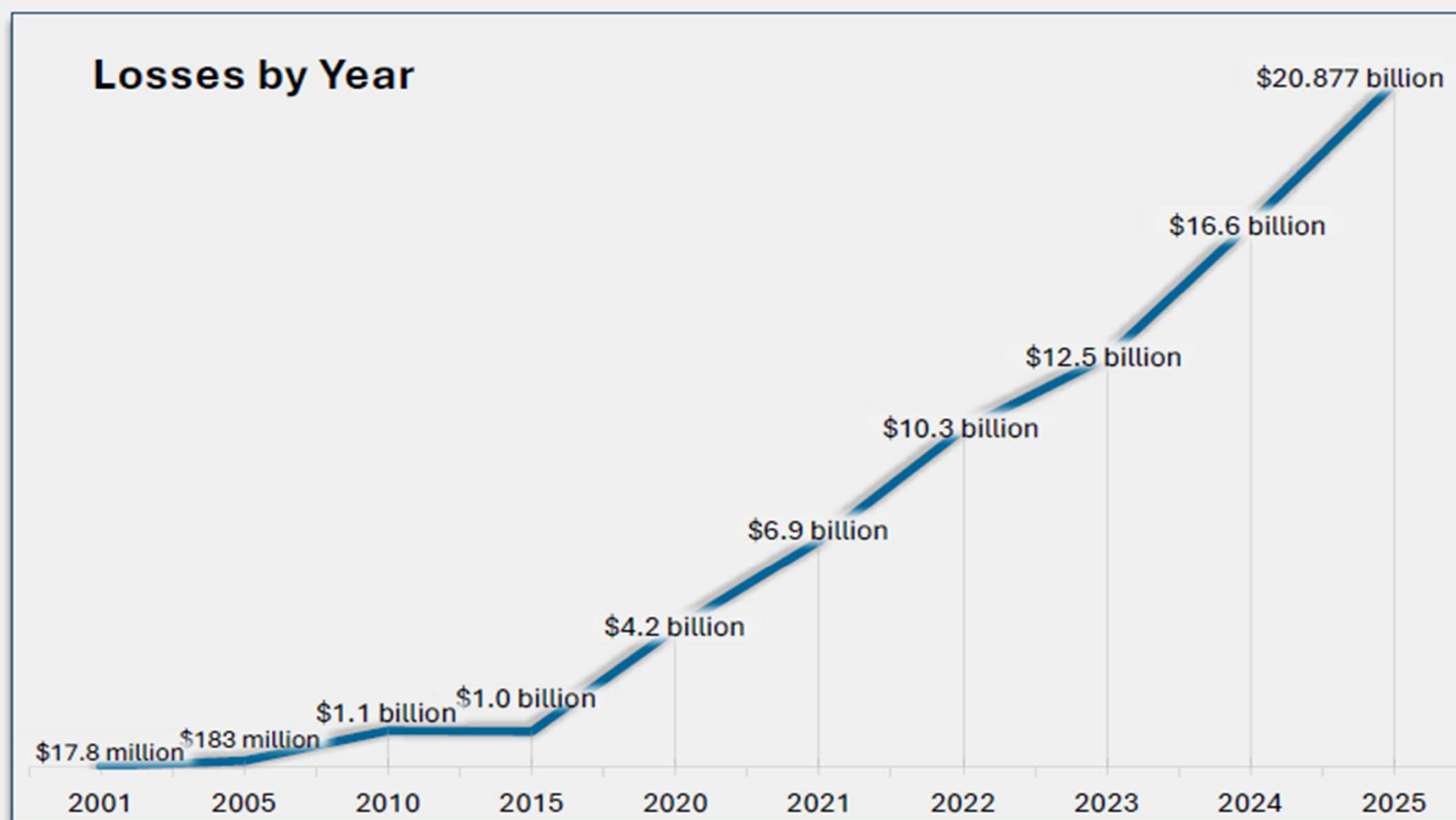

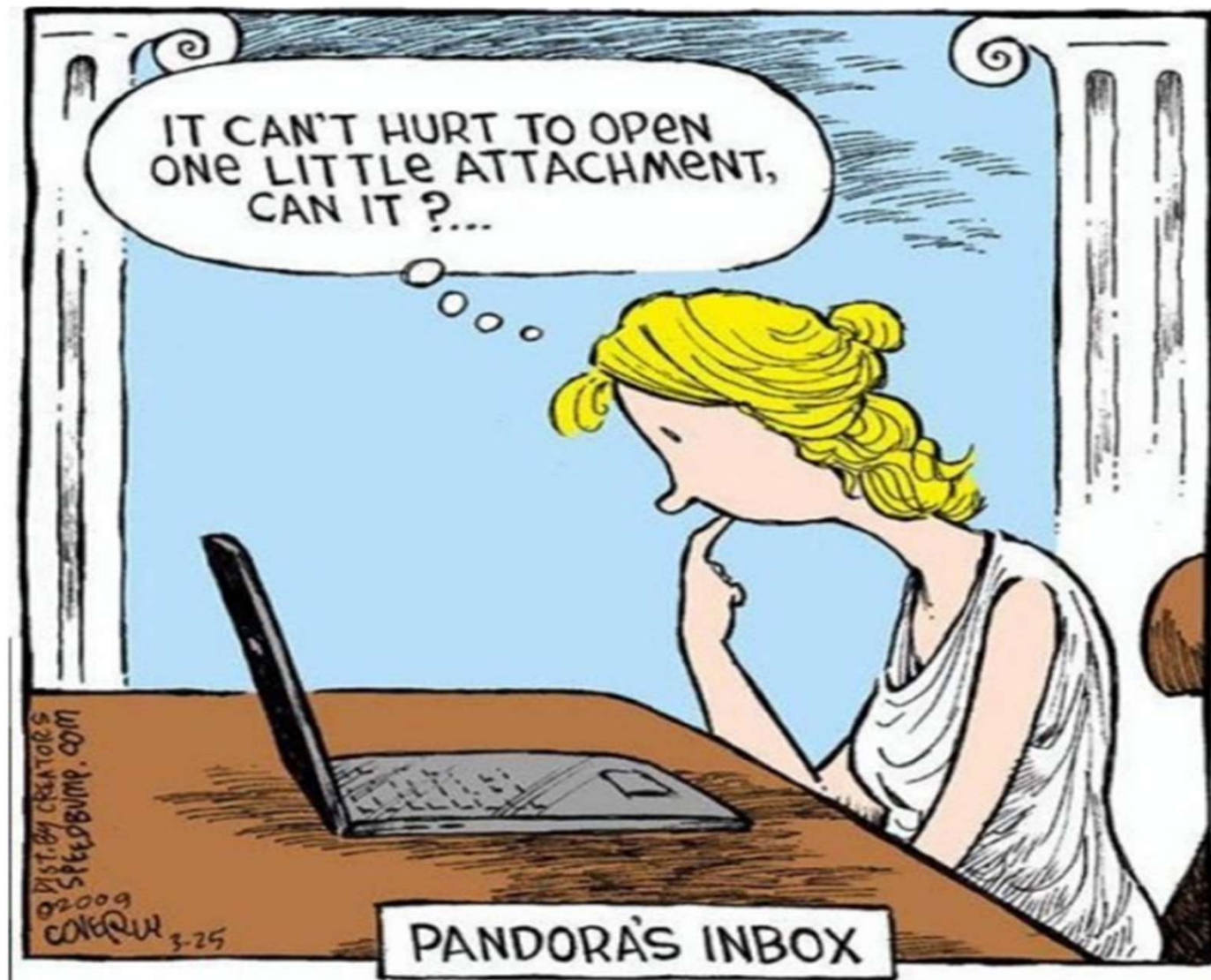

- * Phishing emails (hidden in Spam)
- * Smishing (in text/SMS messages)

Troy Hunt, of the “Have I been Pwned” password leakage tracking service, posted “A Sneaky Phish Just Grabbed My Mailchimp Mailing List.”

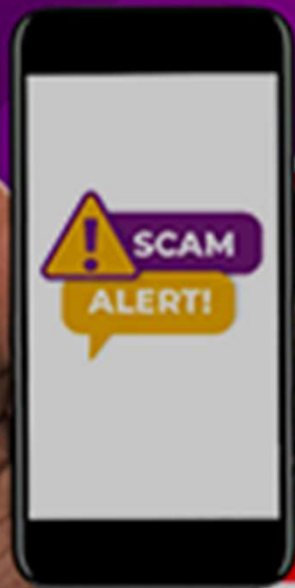

PHISHING AND SMISHING

- * Agentic AI tools act on your behalf.
- * Attacker hides instructions inside emails or documents.
- * You AI to summarize the message, it executes those commands.
- * There are no suspicious links or attachments—just clever prompts.
- * Send your files or take other actions without you ever clicking anything.

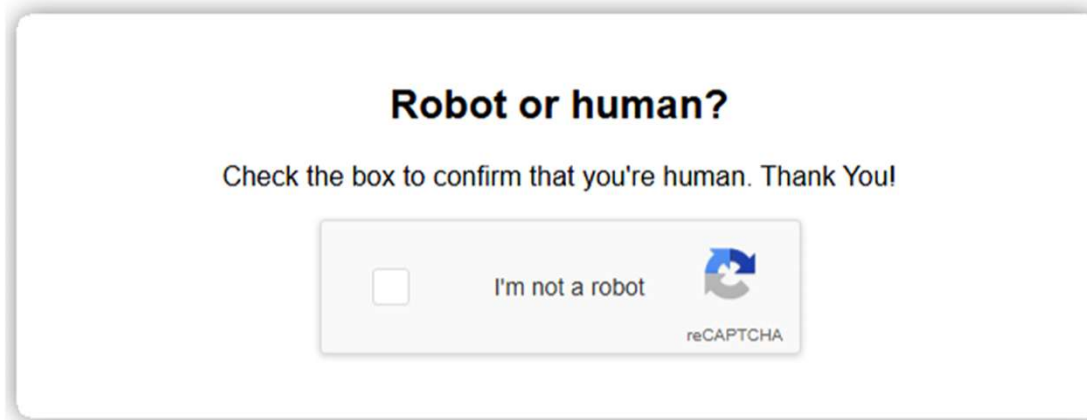


Look out for red flags

- ▮ pressure or threats
- ▮ emotional appeals
- ▮ out-of-context, unexpected messages
- ▮ too good to be true
- ▮ Payment other than credit cards

FAKE CAPTCHA

JavaScript code redirects the user to a page that prompts the user with the familiar CAPTCHA of “I’m not a robot”:



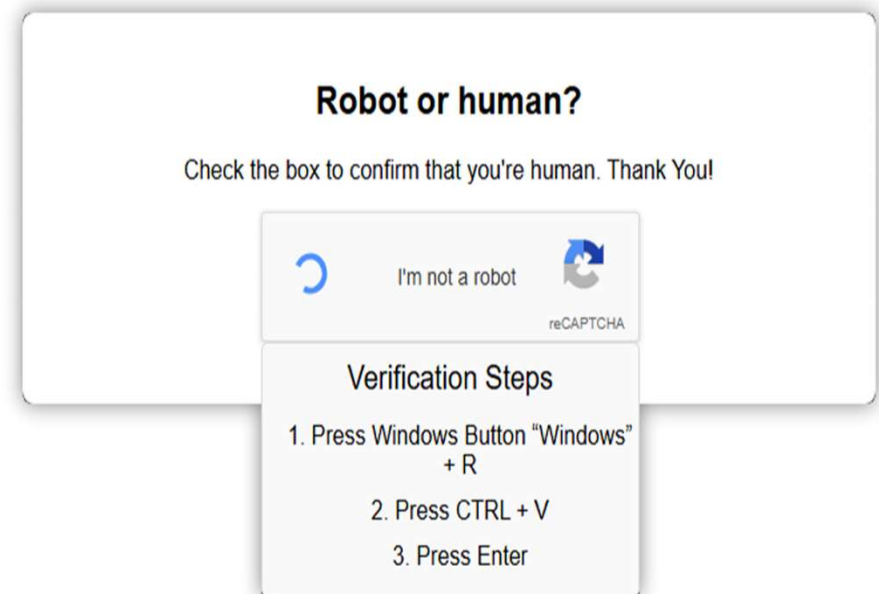

CLICKFIX

The malicious JavaScript displays a drop-down menu with additional steps for the victim:

1. Open the Windows dialog by pressing the Windows key
2. Then press 'R' to give the RUN field the system's focus.
3. The victim is told to press CTRL+V to copy the attack code into the Run command field.
4. Finally, the user is told to press Enter, thereby executing the attack code.

If you call a support person, give them this info:

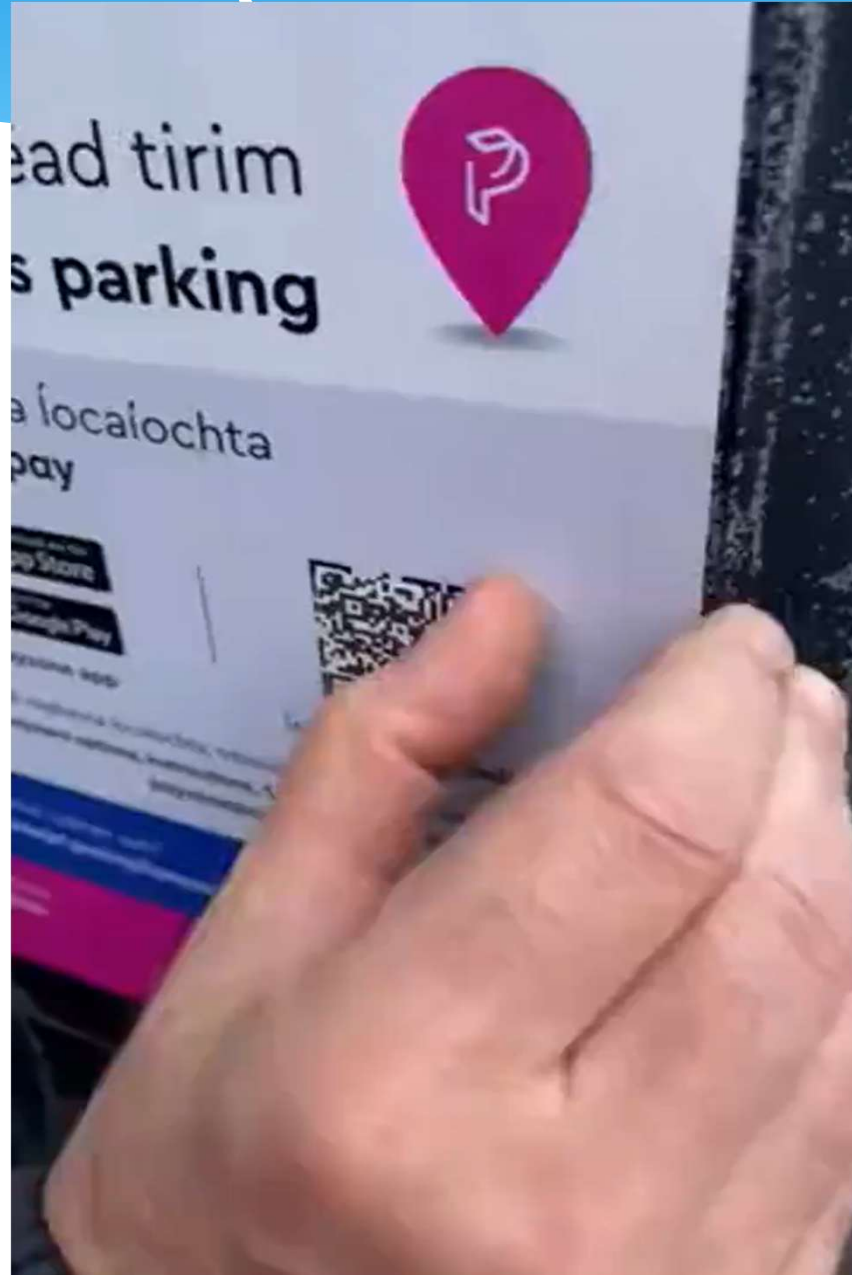
CLICKFIX

- ✓ Use only official stores for apps and browser plugins.
- ✓ Real BSOD screens never have recovery instructions—they only show error codes and reboot notices.
- ✓ Never paste commands or code from websites into the Windows Run box or Command Prompt.
- ✓ Be skeptical of urgent messages, especially those creating time pressure.

PHISHING AND SMISHING

- * Read your messages when you are alert.
- * Beware of odd messages, even from contacts.
- * Use only trusted links and phone numbers.
- * Report and delete.
- * Forward the scam text to 7726 (SPAM)
- * Use anti-malware on your devices.
- * Update your OS and applications.

QUISHING



QUISHING

- * Run your fingernail across the QR code.
- * If there's a detectable edge or thickness, it could be hiding the legitimate sticker.
- * If the QR code lifts away from the surface, don't use it.

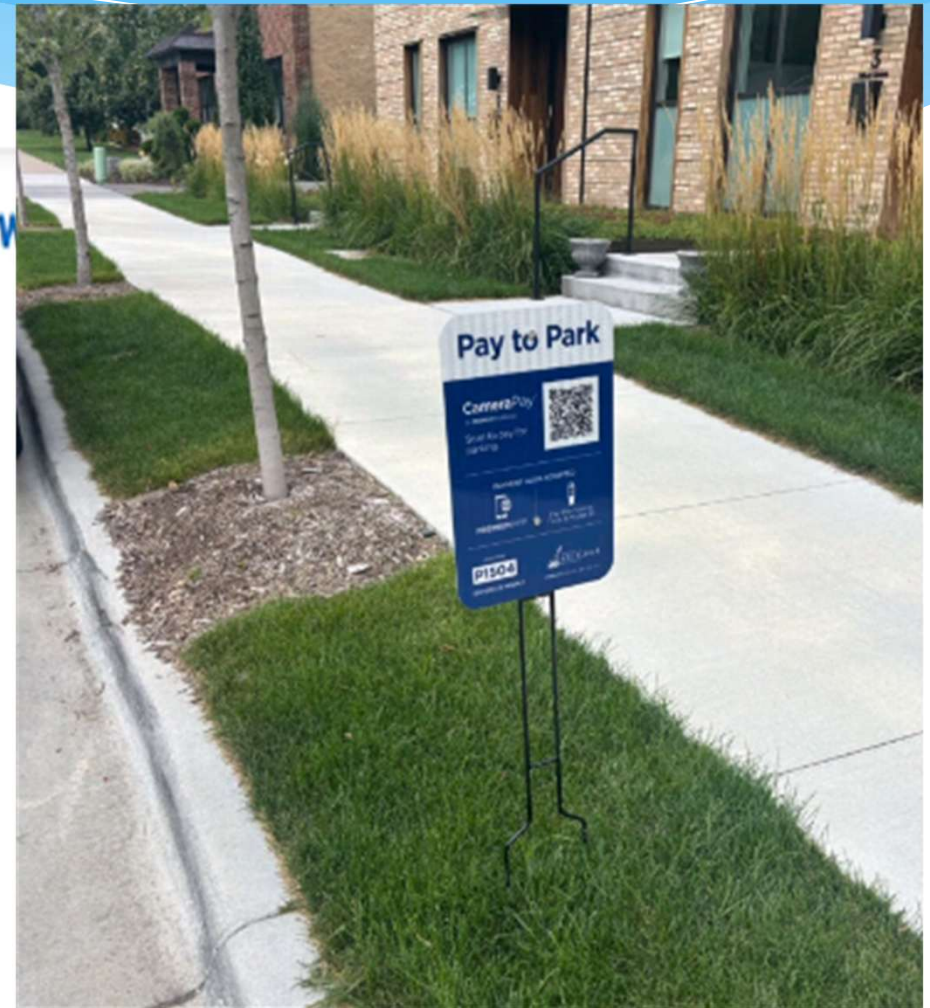

Criminal fraud, phishing-esque, but brilliant nonetheless.



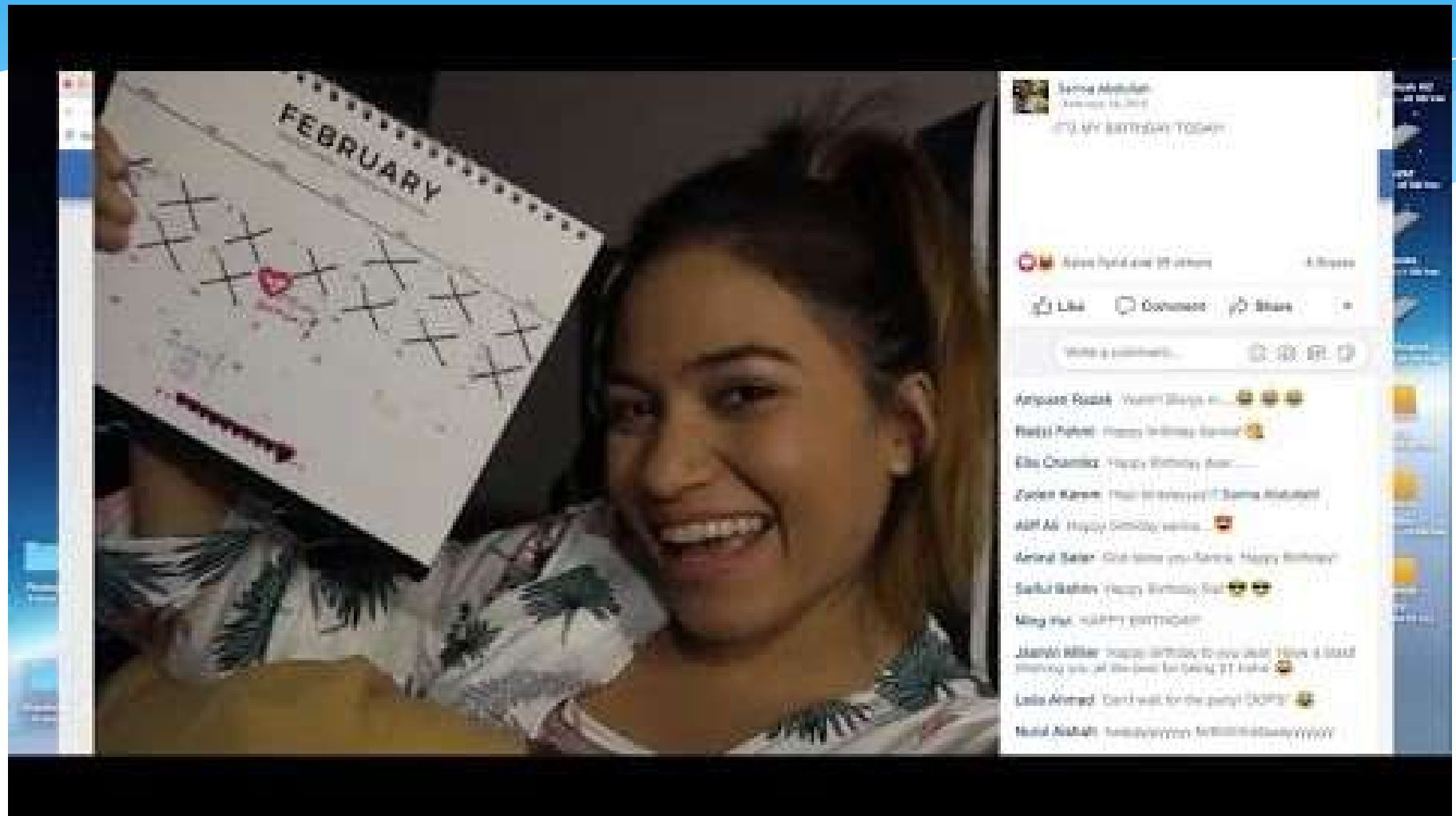
TECH SUPPORT SCAMS



- * Unsolicited Calls from “Big Tech.”
 - * Pop-Up Messages.
 - * Fake Websites.
 - * Pressure to Act Quickly.
 - * Request for Remote Access.

- * Say No! Hang up!
 - * Disconnect internet.
 - * Scan for malware.

Be careful what you share on social media

IDENTITY THEFT

- * Attackers can steal your identity to
 - ❑ charge purchases in your name,
 - ❑ apply for home loans or a mortgage.
 - ❑ leave you with bills and a criminal record.
- * With so many breaches, most of our information is already for sale.
- * See this MCPD QR Code:



IDENTITY THEFT

- * Data brokers collect, analyze, and sell personal data.
- * 4,000–5,000 data brokers globally, at least 1,700 registered in the US.
- * Market valuation of \$270 billion.
- * The criminal value is not just the SSN or DOB.
- * The value is in combining identity data with access credentials, device/session artifacts, and payment functionality.
- * Fraud is increasingly sold as a complete workflow — not as isolated pieces of data.

IDENTITY THEFT PREVENTION

- * Guard your account and PIN numbers.
- * Set up account alerts to spot a problem.
- * Review activity on your written monthly statements.
- * Freeze (not lock) credit for adults and kids.
- * Check credit reports quarterly at <https://www.AnnualCreditReport.com>.

SECURE YOUR DEVICES

- * Update your browser, operating system, and applications automatically.
- * Change default passwords.
- * Only use the official app store.
- * Limit application access.
- * Remove unused applications.
- * Make regular backups of your data.

USE SAFE PASSWORDS

- * Set unique, random passwords for each site.
- * Use strong and random passwords
 - * Or use [passphrases](#) if permitted
 - * Use a password or passphrase generator.
- * If you can remember a password, it's too weak.
- * Use a [password manager](#) to generate and remember your passwords.



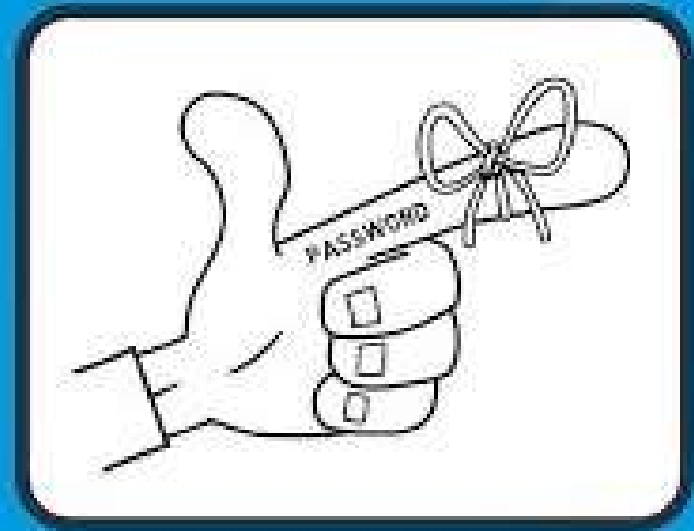

USE SAFE PASSWORDS



- * Lie when answering security questions.
 - * Don't use answers found on Facebook!
- * Check your username/email and password at <https://haveibeenpwned.com/> or <https://www.howexposedami.co.nz/>
- * Don't reuse passwords, or attackers will.



USE SAFE PASSWORDS



MULTIFACTOR AUTHENTICATION

**How MFA
Can Save
You**



MULTIFACTOR AUTHENTICATION

- * Something the user HAS 
- * Something the user IS. 
- * Something the user KNOWS. `!zVMmEo6e#X#`

Even if they have one factor,
attackers won't have the second.

They will not be able to get into
your account or device.

Tokens and authenticator apps.



CYBER SAFE SURFING

- * Look closely at the web address.
- * Beware of look-alikes: amaz**o**n.com
- * Password managers can prevent this.
- * Attackers use AWS & Azure to look legit.
- * Avoid passwordless wifi networks.
- * Use tethering to cellular instead.

CYBER SAFE SURFING

Homoglyph attacks exploit visually similar characters in URLs (like using “**g**oogle.com” instead of “[google.com](https://www.google.com)”).

These characters may come from different alphabets (Latin, Cyrillic, Greek) but appear nearly identical to the human eye.

CYBER SAFE SURFING

The use of the soft hyphen character – combined with splitting the subject into multiple MIME encoded words – was clearly intended as an attempt at bypassing e-mail filtering mechanisms that are supposed to automatically detect potentially malicious messages.

CYBER SAFE SURFING

- * Be careful what you download.
- * Don't click on anything in an unsolicited email or text message that asks you to update or verify your account information.
- * Instead, go to a website via your bookmarks or password manager.

CYBER SAFE SURFING

If you **must** click that link:

- Enable URL highlighting in browsers; focus on the domain name.
- Always hover over link before clicking.
- Check for odd characters or spelling.
- Beware of shortened URLs; preview them first.
 - Right-click on the URL and copy,
 - Go to in-private/incognito browsing mode,
 - Carefully read the URL before moving forward.

CYBER SAFE SURFING

- * Be cautious sharing online or on social media.
- * Wait until you return before bragging about your vacation.
- * Avoid sharing pet names, schools attended, links to family members, and birthdays.
- * Don't give scammers the data they need to guess your password, answer your security questions, steal your identity, and rob you.

- * **Tricky apps download a digital shark onto your phone**

CYBER SAFE SURFING

Building better scams with AI

CYBER SAFE SURFING

Verify “out-of-band.”

- * Look up the company info on your own,
- * Don't use info provided by a potential scammer.
- * Use your bookmarks or your links from your password manager to verify if the message is legit.

CYBERCRIME PREVENTION

- Beware of urgent claims. Slow down.
- Be honest with your feelings: vulnerability, greed, or FOMO.
- Govt agencies don't call or email out-of-the-blue
 - nor demand payment in gift cards or cryptocurrency.
 - They "snail mail" official notices.
- Ask a trusted friend or relative to get a second opinion.
- Report cyber crime to the authorities. WWW.IC3.GOV
REPORTFRAUD.FTC.GOV and [MCPD 301-279-8000](tel:3012798000)
- Beware of recovery scams.

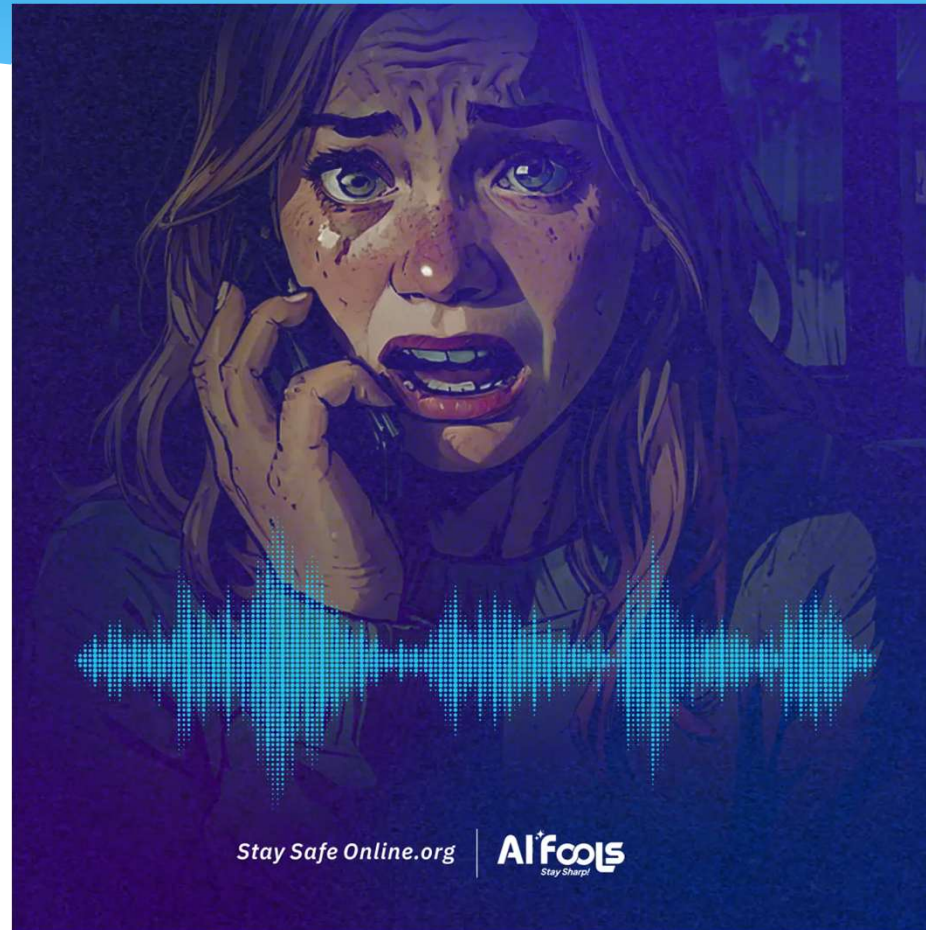
Is that Chatbot Your Friend?

- * The average American has fewer than three friends.
- * Chatbots are designed for engagement.
- * We are inclined to personify AI bots.
- * Who is sponsoring them to what end?
- * Attribution and motivation are difficult to assess.
- * These chatbots will seem to understand us, so AI from adversaries can get past our defenses.

CYBERCRIME PREVENTION



Virtual kidnapping: Why should you use safe words

Detecting Deepfakes

- * Beware of looking for technical errors.
- * Any error today will be corrected tomorrow.
- * Like any scam, focus on the context.
- * Also, look for:
 - ❑ Urgency, FOMO, or pressure to act.
 - ❑ Requests for sensitive information.
 - ❑ Seems out of context.
 - ❑ Too good to be true.

EXTORTION

- * Criminal gangs leverage intimate or compromising content.
- * They cause emotional trauma and financial loss.
- * So “friend” only the people you know in real life.
- * Secure and monitor social media accounts.
- * Cease communications.
- * Report to 301-279-8000.
- * Special Victims Investigations Division



INTERNET OF (INSECURE) THINGS

- * The “S” in IoT stands for security.
- * IoT devices have complete OS and webapps.
- * Rarely updated, so bugs are rarely fixed.
- * Devices provide a beachhead into your home.
- * Attackers can easily listen and watch you.
- * Cryptominers uses electricity & computers.
- * Your IoT can attack others.
- * Beware of cars leaking sensitive data.

PROTECTING IOT

- * If you don't buy it, it can't harm you.
- * Change default passwords.
- * Cover cameras when not in use.
- * Put IoT on a separate network from your laptops and smartphones.
- * Buy devices from reputable makers that provide automatic updates.

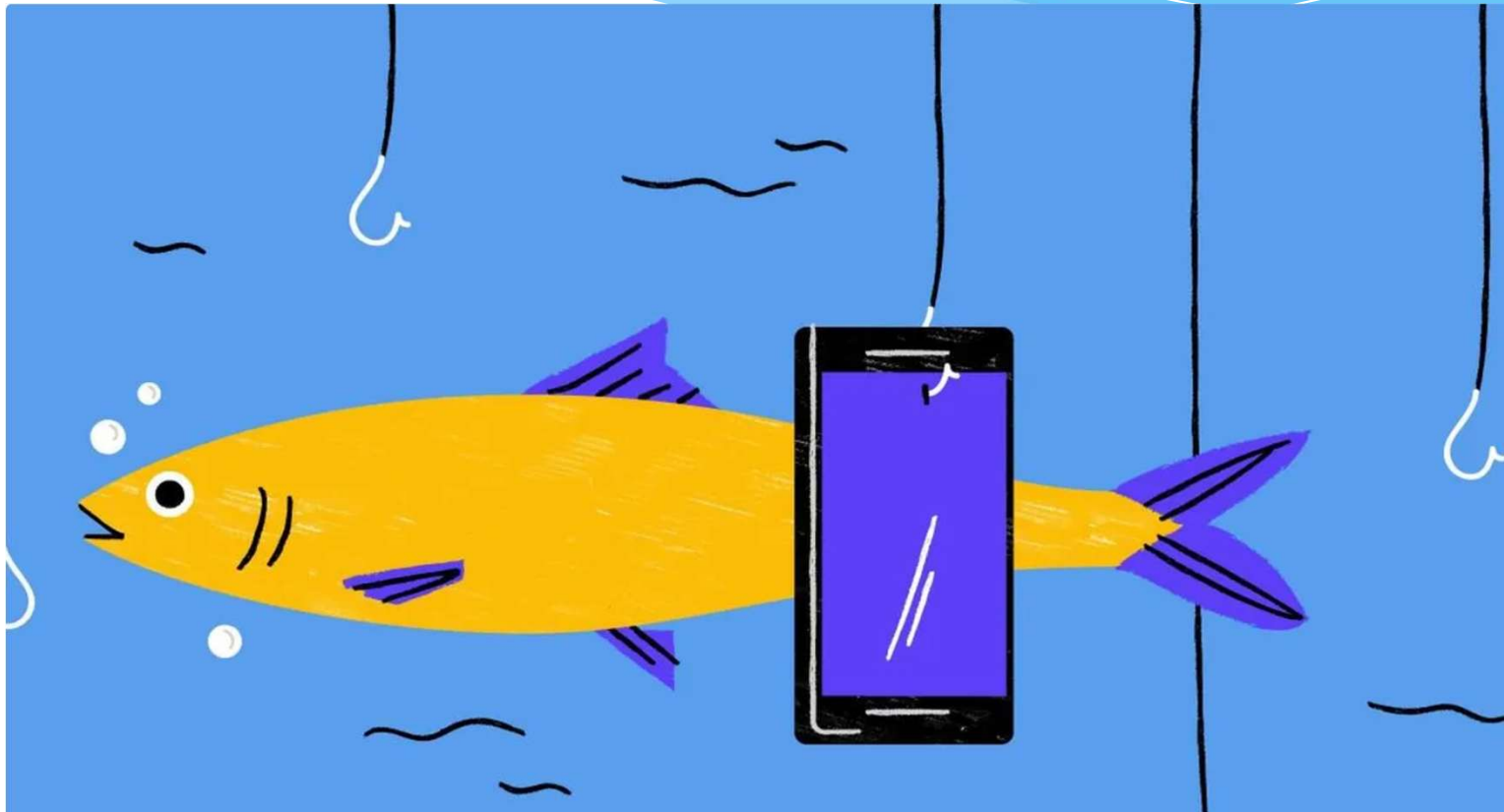
